## Village Vehicle Stickers Due by July 1

Applications for 2025 vehicle stickers will be mailed in mid-May. Stickers must be displayed on all vehicles registered or garaged in Deerfield by July 1. Stickers for passenger vehicles cost \$30 if purchased by June 30. After June 30, a 50 percent late penalty is assessed. If you do not receive your application, you still need to have your stickers by July 1. Additional applications are available online or at Village Hall. The Village offers an online payment system for vehicle stickers. Visit [www.deerfield.il.us](http://www.deerfield.il.us) and click the "Pay Online" button on the website's homepage. There is no additional charge for online payment. Additional vehicle sticker purchasing options include in-person at Village Hall, returning the renewal application by mail, or using the payment drop box located in the median just south of Village Hall on Jewett Park Drive. The deadline to display a new 2025 sticker is July 1.

## Public Art Program Call for Artists

**The Deerfield Public Art Program is soliciting artwork loans from artists to display in public places for one year.**

Artists must be willing to loan works of art for public display for up to one year. The Deerfield Fine Arts Commission will jury review artwork proposals submitted by artists interested in having their works displayed in the community.



The program is soliciting paintings, murals, drawings, and other pieces that could be displayed in Village Hall, Public Works, Deerfield Park District facilities, the Deerfield Public Library and the sculpture park at the corner of Waukegan and Deerfield Roads.

The program is open to all visual artists who meet the following criteria:

- Artists who are professional and of serious intent.
- Artists working in any permanent media.
- Art students working with practicing artists/teachers may be considered.
- Artists must have knowledge of public art. While previous experience in public art is not required, artists should be knowledgeable of materials, techniques and public art processes.
- Appropriateness of an artist's work for public display. (Appropriateness in terms of scale, material, content and placement.)
- All selected artwork must be delivered to the village "ready-to-hang" for immediate display.

The Fine Arts Commission is responsible for reviewing artwork submissions and making a final recommendation to the Village Manager's Office regarding final artwork selections.

Artists may submit up to three pieces of art for consideration and must submit a completed application packet for each individual artwork being submitted. The deadline for submissions is May 30, 2025 Applications are available at [deerfield.il.us](http://deerfield.il.us) and at the QR code.

### Lawn Sprinkling RPZ Regulations

From May 15 through September 15, lawn sprinkling regulations will be in place.

Even numbered addresses may water on even numbered dates from midnight to noon and/or from 6 p.m. to midnight. Odd numbered addresses may water on odd numbered dates from midnight to noon and/or from 6 p.m. to midnight. This applies only to lawn sprinkling.

All irrigation systems are required to have a backflow prevention device called a Reduced Pressure Zone

Backflow Preventer (RPZ) that is certified annually by a licensed inspector. This testing must be completed every year. The deadline for residential RPZs is June 30.

The Village has contracted with Backflow Solutions, Inc. (BSI) to administer the backflow prevention tracking program. The annual backflow assembly test report must be submitted electronically by your inspector via the BSI Online system at [www.BSIOnline.com](http://www.BSIOnline.com).

## Hazel Avenue Reconstruction Project

The 2025 Hazel Avenue Reconstruction Project includes the full water main replacement, roadway reconstruction and sidewalk improvements between Waukegan Road and Wilmot Road. This project was designed to meet federal funding standards and in 2023, was selected to receive nearly \$5M in federal funding.

The contractor began work between Chestnut Street and Waukegan Road in April, which required a full closure and detour for motorists. The contractor anticipates completing the project by November 2025. Motorists are encouraged to seek alternate routes during construction when possible.

### Flood Information

#### Flood Hazard Areas

Special Flood Hazard Areas (100-year floodplain) in the Village of Deerfield are located near the Middle Fork and West Fork of the North Branch of the Chicago River. The eastern portion of Deerfield is in the Middle Fork watershed, while the western part of town is in the West Fork watershed.

#### Flood Recommendations

The following common-sense guidelines can help protect you from the dangers of flooding:

- Stay away from power lines and electrical wires. If your house is about to be flooded, turn off the power at the service box. Electrical current can travel through water. Electrocutation is the second leading cause of death during floods.
- Be alert for gas leaks. Turn off the gas to your house before it floods. If you smell gas, report it to a Village official or your gas company. Do not use candles, lanterns or open flames if you smell gas or are unsure if your gas has been shut off.

- Keep children away from the flood waters, ditches, culverts and storm drains. Flood waters can carry items that have dislodged themselves.
- Clean everything that has gotten wet. Flood water will be contaminated with sewage and other chemicals that pose severe health threats.
- Look out for animals, especially snakes. Small animals flooded out of their homes may seek shelter in yours.
- Do not use gas engines, such as generators, or charcoal fires indoors during power outages. Carbon monoxide exhaust can pose serious health hazards.

#### Additional Information

The Village of Deerfield Engineering Department also provides assistance with flooding or drainage concerns. Village staff can visit your property, if required, and help to assess the problem and may be able to offer solutions. The localized flood protection service is provided by the Engineering Department.

## Memorial Patch Fundraiser

During the month of May, Deerfield Police Officers will wear memorial patches on their uniforms in honor of National Police Week, May 11-17, 2025. ## 2025 Cop on a Rooftop May 17

## E-Bike Safety Guidelines

Electric bicycles (e-bikes) have electric motors that in combination with pedaling makes them faster than traditional bicycles. In the interest of safety for e-bike riders, motor vehicle drivers and pedestrians, e-bike riders should be smart and cautious while operating their bikes. Riders can ensure a safer riding experience by following these guidelines:

- **Follow Illinois Traffic Laws** – All motorized vehicles and bikes are treated as vehicles and must follow Illinois Vehicle Code and Village of Deerfield Municipal Code. This includes stopping at traffic signs and yielding the right-of-way. Driving on the sidewalk is not allowed.
- **Protect Yourself** – Always wear a helmet to maintain safety. Know what kind of helmets support the specific speeds of your or for public safety.
- **See and Be Seen** – Be aware of vehicle traffic and drive predictably. Don't weave in and out



of traffic and be courteous to pedestrians. Remember you are not as visible to drivers as they are to you. If your bike doesn't have built-in signals, use appropriate hand signals.

## Police Civilian Personnel Appreciation Week

The Illinois Association of Chiefs of Police designates the first full week of June as Law Enforcement Civilian Personnel Appreciation Week, a time dedicated to recognizing and honoring the hard work and commitment of the civilian personnel who play a crucial role in supporting law enforcement agencies. At the Deerfield Police Department, civilian personnel include a diverse range of individuals, such as Telecommunicators, Records Specialists, Social Workers, a Community Service Officer and a Management Analyst. These dedicated professionals contribute significantly to the department's daily operations and overall success. Their responsibilities range from providing administrative support to offering specialized expertise and services, all of which support officers and ensure an efficient, effective law enforcement environment.

## April 2025 Consolidated Election Results

The 2025 Consolidated Election was held on April 1, and unofficial results show four incumbents were reelected and joined by one new Trustee.

Mayor Dan Shapiro and Trustee Mary Oppenheim were reelected to four-year terms, continuing their service to the Deerfield community. Trustee Bob Benton was also reelected, earning a two-year term. Trustee Jennifer Goldstone won her first election to a four-year term after previously being appointed to fill a vacancy on the Board. Joining them is Jesse Greenberg, who was elected to a four-year term as Trustee.

The Village thanks outgoing Trustee Rebekah Metts-Childers for her four years of service to the community.

## EPA Water Monitoring Results

The Village water system first began sampling for the EPA mandated fifth Uncontrolled Contaminant Monitoring Rule (UCMR 5) in early 2024. These unregulated contaminants are those that don't yet have a drinking water standard set by the EPA. The purpose of monitoring for these contaminants is to help the EPA to decide whether the contaminants should have a standard. The Village's first round of samples of our water system were all undetectable for these contaminants.
